The Army Women's Foundation is a private, non-profit 501(c)(3) organization originally established in 1969. The mission of the Foundation is to promote public interest in the Army and the women who serve in it. The Foundation recognizes and honors the service of Army women and supports the U.S. Army Women's Museum located at Fort Lee, Virginia.

The U.S. Army Women's Museum showcases the contributions of women to the Army from the American Revolution to present. Founded as the Women's Army Corps Museum at Fort McClellan, Alabama in 1955, it is part of the Army Museum System; it also provides educational programs for Soldiers and school age children.

The Museum has a large archive and collection of uniforms and artifacts. It serves to capture and preserve the Soldier's stories, past and present. It features changing and special exhibits such as the compelling TV-based *Casualty Kiosk* where visitors can read the stories of women who have perished serving their country in Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom.

Our Foundation is managed by a national Board of Directors, with offices located at Fort Lee, Virginia and in the Washington, D.C. area.
